10/40 WINDOW

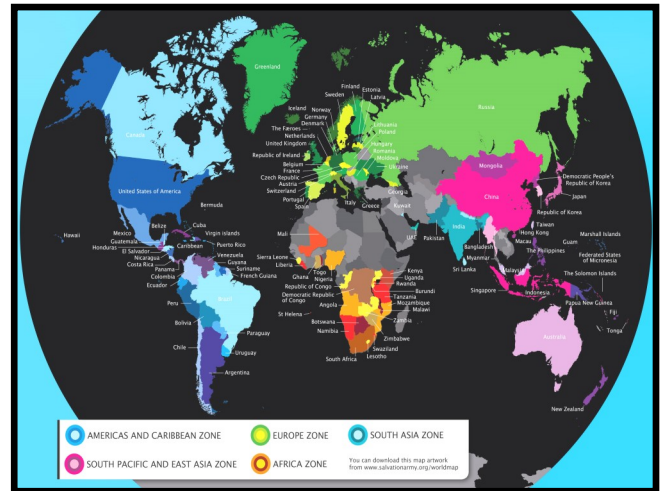
There are over 3.6 billion unreached people in the world today according to a group called “The Joshua Project” who keeps up with identifying people groups around the world who do not know about Jesus. 88% live in or near the 10/40 Window, which refers to an area within 10 and 40 degrees latitude from Western Africa to Eastern Asia. According to the Joshua Project, the top 50 least evangelized megacities are in the 10/40 Window where 2.91 billion individuals live.

While we in The Army often pride ourselves with stating that The Salvation Army is in 127 countries around the world, how often do we think about where we are not.

As every good Salvationist would do, I consulted the 2018 Year Book and sure enough the area referred to above is a “grey” area on the map depicting the 5 Zones where we have established work. Western Sahara, Morocco, Algeria, Libya, Egypt, Sudan, Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Iran, Iraq, Afghanistan, Turkey are some of the countries included in this “zone”. While The Army sometimes has opportunities to get into these places because of disasters or helping refugees or victims of war, their opportunity to hear the gospel is very slim or near impossible. This is a very troubled part of our world and often is in the news. Evangelizing is prohibited and Christianity is met with opposition and resentment.

If God lays it upon your heart to go, then you should, but for most of us, it would be difficult to go. But as we know, and the Joshua Project also reveals, people from that world have come to ours. Sadly, even though some may now live where it would be easier to hear the gospel..... someone needs to go and tell them.

One of Jesus’ last instructions was to “Go into all the world and preach the Gospel” and with so many who have not heard, that is still needed today....All Christians need to think of themselves as missionaries and be actively sharing the gospel.



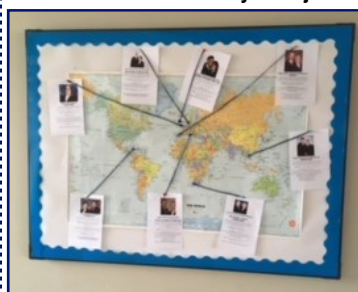

"GIVE UP YOUR SMALL AMBITIONS" by Michael Griffiths (Moody Press, 1970), is a manual suggesting important points about preparation for missionary service (or, as the author prefers, "international service").

Griffiths was General Director of the Overseas Missionary Fellowship and wrote about the Call, the Need, the Qualifications, and the Logistics. He also addressed questions about Marriage, Children, or none of the above; Cultures and Communication; Identification; Professional or non-professional; and gives still timely advice on many other matters.

This book influenced me more than any other in my early international experience and I have found it impossible to give up...until recently I met a very bright 14 year old who is excited about becoming a missionary.
