“FROM THE MISSIONARY BOOK SHELF”

Preparation for service in another country may involve studying a new language, but also one should think about studying the culture as well. A history of the country or culture is a good place to start, and often the best books will not necessarily be Christian publications.

For example, *Distant Neighbors: A Portrait of the Mexicans*, was written by Alan Riding, the New York Times bureau chief in Mexico City for 6 years. It has historical analyses and also cultural background.

My second-hand copy of the Spanish language edition, had an inscription in the front from the mother who gave it to her son. She wrote: “Some of what this man says is painful for us to hear but we still need to learn about ourselves and admit the truth.”

The book had been recommended to me, but this gave me confidence that the analysis would be on the money.
