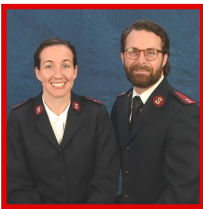

(March 23) – "Thank you for your prayer support. We are about to enter a national 21 day lockdown. Due to our limited funds, we have only been able to give a little extra food in preparation for the lockdown. We had about 4 times the number of people seek food parcels this month. We prepared some Sunday School, Jr. Soldier and Corps Cadet materials for the corps kids to take home last Sunday. Many people live far away and in areas that can be dangerous to visit. In fact, we had a break-in at the corps last weekend. The person bent the fence to avoid the electric wire and went through a small bathroom window. They took our sound board and Tim's iPad. They also broke the blade off our paper cutter and used it to try to break into the safe. However, we are all fine and no other items were damaged or missing. We will lose our main income for 3 weeks while the Thrift Store will be closed. Many of the corps members are connected on social media. We expect to use this platform for staying connected. Some of the Home League ladies have asked to have a Bible Study. Our corps people here are a blessing. Many have been through very difficult challenges already and their faith is unshakable. Yesterday, we were able to pick up our "new" van, thanks to the generosity of the Southern Territory. The kids were excited to have a little more space and enjoy the a/c when we went to get groceries today. Our kid's schools already had a 2 week break scheduled, so we will only lose one week and then will start online classes, most likely. We are still clinging to our verse for this season" Joshua 1:9

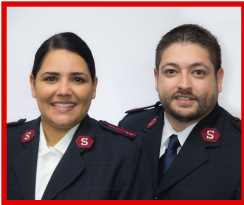

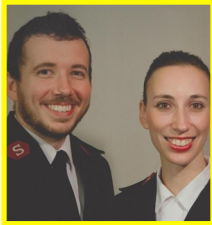

Director of Rome Social Centre & Guesthouse, Support Officer to the Finance Dept., CO of the Rome Corps and Chaplaincy for the Social Centre. (March 27) "We feel like we are living through a war, only it is peaceful. The boys and I do not wander off the Army compound. Andy goes to the grocery store about twice a week. We are serving 3 meals a day to about 170 people who live here on the compound. The food is prepared and we hand pack and deliver it to their individual rooms. There is a team of officers and volunteers who take care of all of this work. During these visits the well-being of clients is checked. Our ministry to people living on the street continues with the blessing of the government. We cook fresh hot meals here for several hundred people and deliver them. Our boys are in the house all day. Elijah's school work is difficult to track but we are managing. Our largest concern long-term is about the loss of income, yet regular expenses remain the same. This region experienced MRSA years ago and have learned from that. The government has been proactive in keeping the Virus as contained as possible. There are growing cases and there are concerns, but we are keeping calm. Movement has been dwindling and this weekend has been a lockdown and curfews for sanitation of the roads. We are having virtual meetings and we are keeping in communication with our people through phone calls and messages. Many are going to have difficulties because of jobs not paying them, being laid off, and visa situations. We are helping with some financial assistance, especially for food. Our children have been with us for 3 weeks. Supposedly, they will be back in school the first week of April; however, we think it will be longer.
